The New Zealand Protestant Protests against the Roman Catholic religion as a counterfeit Christian church, and makes a stand for and upon the English text of the 1611 Authorised Bible.



1517 Luther Protested against Rome and now in 2017 Lutherans Unite.

2017 is an historic year in Christendom when the church (the body of Christ) celebrates the 500th anniversary of Martin Luther nailing his 95 Theses to the door of the Wittenberg Castle Church as a protest against the efficacy of Papal indulgences. This event ignited the “Protestant Reformation” around the world.

On October 31st 2017 Lutherans celebrate their founder’s protest alongside Roman Catholics - acknowledging that there is more that UNITES than divides.

This, our first article, will provide a time-line of key milestones of the Roman Catholic and Protestant churches over the past 500 years, and ask the question - how did this reversal from Protest to Unity take place?

Articles 2-6 that follow will answer this question asserting that Rome has, since the Reformation, determined the destruction of Protestantism -

- A. by first murdering Protestants, and
- B. then beguiling them into seeking Unity, and
- C. lastly by seducing them into accepting her authorities.

Timeline of history outlining key milestones.

1513-16 - Luther established the doctrine of “justifica-

tion by faith” after labouring over Rom.1: 17 - “Luther considered justification by faith ‘the summary of all Christian doctrine’ and ‘the article by which the church stands or falls’.”

1517 -31 October - Luther nailed his 95 Thesis to the door of the Wittenberg Castle Church.

1520 - Luther published three monumental works. Two examples are -

i) To the Christian Nobility of the German Nation - where he protested against the authority of the Pope.

ii) On the Babylonian Captivity of the Church - where he wrote “What is asserted without the Scriptures or proven revelation may be held as an opinion, but need not be believed.”

1521 - The Diet of Worms - Luther appeared before the Roman Catholic Imperial Diet in the city of Worms and would not recant, and was subsequently declared a heretic by Pope Leo X.

1530 - Augsburg Confession - Luther outlined the doctrines of the Lutheran church.

1534 - King Henry VIII of England separated himself from the Roman Catholic Church in Rome and became supreme head of the Church of England.

1536 - John Calvin published his “Systematic Theology: Institute of the Christian Religion”, and established his five points of TULIP - as foundational doctrine of Calvinism.

1534 Society of Jesus is established as a Roman Catholic counter to the Protestant Reformation.

1545 - 63 - The Council of Trent - an Ecumenical Council of the Roman Catholic Church was established to counter
